Students in grades 7-12 can apply to volunteer. Volunteers in grades 7 and 8 must be residents of the City of Falls Church. Anyone wishing to volunteer should fill out the <u>online volunteer application form</u>. This form must be completed and volunteers must attend training before beginning service.

Food for Others

Food for Others is an important part of Northern Virginia's safety net for those needing food when an emergency strikes and for the growing number of working poor who need to supplement their inadequate food supplies.

Volunteers are needed for working in the warehouse (individuals and groups) and must be at least 12 years old. Children ages 12-15 must be accompanied by an adult.
